


Reaching New Audiences:

Over the course of several months, we have read Frances Hodgson Burnett's, The Secret Garden, to students. The choice of the book was made by the students and their teacher.


An Outreach Program to a class of Grade 5 students from WayWaySeeCappo First




Operating Expenses: \$140,312

RECOMMENDED FORM OF SUPPORT

The Russell & District Regional Library is a Registered Charity.

Gifts and bequests to the Library are tax deductible under the federal income, estate, and gift tax laws. For federal tax purposes, the Library uses its formal corporate name: The Russell & District Regional Library. The Library Board recommends that for estate planning purposes, friends consider the following language for use in their wills:

"To the Russell & District Regional Library a not-for-profit, tax-exempt organization incorporated in the province of Manitoba in [year], having as its principal address 339 Main Street North, Russell, Manitoba, R0J 1W0, Canada, I [name], of [City, Province, Postal Code], hereby give, devise, and bequeath [a dollar amount, percentage of residuary estate, or description of property] for its general purposes." Unless otherwise specified, donations will be placed in the Russell and District Regional Library's Endowment Fund.

If you wish to make a bequest for a specific purpose, it is suggested that you consider adding the following language to any restriction you may impose on your bequest:

"If at any time in the judgement of the Library Board, the designated purpose of this bequest proves to be impracticable or impossible, I authorize the Board to use the income and principal of this bequest for any purpose they deem to be consistent with the general intent and purpose set forth herein."

Should you decide to leave a bequest to the Library in your will, you will become a member of the Library's legacy society, (Living Legacy Community Foundation), created to recognize the generosity of those individuals who include this institution in their estate plans. The Library expresses its gratitude to members during their lifetime by inviting them to special events and by listing their names on donor publications, unless they prefer to remain anonymous.
